We are all connected through water. We drink it, wash with it, clean with it, flush with it and water our plants with it. We also admire Boston's beautiful harbor, rivers and ponds. Water is central to life in Boston. Keeping our waterways pollution free is important to everyone.

We recently expanded our website to provide you with in-depth information on what we are doing to protect Boston's waterways—and how you can help.

What You Will Find on the Site

The home page presents an interactive search of ways to prevent water pollution.

There are three main sections: Wastewater, Tap Water and Stormwater. Each of these sections gives you an overview of the topic and includes a short, informational video. Learn about the path our water travels from Quabbin Reservoir to your home. Watch Boston residents take a blind taste test of tap vs. bottled water. Better understand where water goes after we use it.
