Don't Pour It Down the Drain! Proper Disposal of Fats, Oils, and Grease

As the holiday season approaches, there's one rule every home cook should remember—**Don't dump fats, oils, or grease (FOG) down the drain!**

The Problem With FOG

FOG is a leading cause of sewer overflows. When FOG cools inside pipes, it can cause clogs. These clogs may lead to backups in either your home's pipes or Boston's sewer system.

Where Does FOG Come From?

FOG results from food preparation, and its main sources are:

- Cooking oil
- Sauces
- Butter and margarine
- Food scraps
- Lard
- Dairy products



Knowing What to Do

There are some simple things you can do to minimize FOG accumulation and prevent unpleasant sewer backups, flooding, and costly damage to your property and the environment (see sidebar). This holiday season, and throughout the year, knowing what to do with FOG can save you from some costly repairs.

Six Tips to Keep FOG Out of the Sewer System

- 1** Never pour grease down sink drains or into toilets or garbage disposals.
- 2** Pour grease into a covered, disposable container, and put it into the trash. (See back page for how to get—and use—a free grease can lid.)
- 3** Soak up remaining fats, oils, and grease with paper towels, and dispose of with your trash.
- 4** Before you wash pans or dishes, scrape fatty food scraps into the trash—**not** into the sink or garbage disposal.
- 5** Put baskets or strainers in sink drains to catch food scraps and other solids, and empty the drain basket or strainer into the trash.
- 6** Use garbage disposals only for fruits, vegetables, and other organic waste.

How to Get—and Use—a Free Grease Can Lid

Boston Water and Sewer Commission can help you dispose of fats, oils, and grease properly and keep FOG out of the sewer system. We're offering each of our customers a **free, reusable** grease can lid.

How to Use the Lid

- 1 Let FOG cool in the pan.
- 2 Pour the cooled FOG into a can.
- 3 Cover the can with your free lid, and store it in your freezer.
- 4 When the can is full, remove the lid. Put the can into the trash on your regular trash collection day.
- 5 Reuse the lid on your next grease can.

Remember:

Cool It. Can It. Trash It.

It's fast, it's easy, and it's very effective.
