#### Toss That Tea!

BWSC was honored to celebrate the 245th anniversary of the Boston Tea Party with the Boston Tea Party Ships and Museum (BTPSM) on December 16, 2018. Each year BTPSM invites the public to honor the anniversary of the Boston Tea Party, considered to be one of the most important events leading up to the American Revolution.

In keeping with BWSC's "Don't Dump" campaign, the tea dumped into the harbor is biodegradable, and all other props used in the reenactment were made to float and easy to identify for retrieval from Boston Harbor after the event. BWSC took to social media to engage with the event. We were also there to celebrate, spending the day at Abigail's Tea Room to greet visitors to the museum, and answer questions on the importance of keeping Boston Harbor clean.

#### FOG Grease Lid Giveaway

Each November BWSC celebrates the holiday season with Boston residents by organizing a Grease Lid Giveaway at a major supermarket. BWSC handed out nearly 1,000 lids to residents.

BWSC's Grease Lids are designed to help store excess cooking Fats, Oils, and Grease (FOG). This is an important step in preventing FOG from entering the sink and potentially clogging the drain in your home.

There are 3 steps for properly disposing of FOG: 1) After cooking, let FOG cool in the pan. 2) Once cooled, pour or scoop cooled FOG into a disposable can. 3) Cover the can with a BWSC grease lid and store in the freezer. When the can is full, remove the lid for reuse, and put the can in the trash.

## **Prepare for Winter and Prevent Frozen Pipes**

If there is no water coming into your home,

call BWSC's 24-hour Emergency Assistance Line at 617-989-7000.

**Insulate pipes** in unheated spaces such as garages, basements, and crawl spaces.

Keep cabinet doors open during cold spells to allow warm air to circulate around the pipes.

Seal openings in your home that would allow cold air to leak through.

Know where the water shutoff valve is in your home and how to turn it off.





1. Shovel out fire hydrants so the Boston Fire Department can access them guickly in case of emergency.

2. Clear snow, ice, and debris from the tops of catch basins to prevent street flooding as snow and ice melt.

#### **Request a BWSC Grease Lid**



BWSC grease lids can be used to help store excess FOG. Boston residents can request a FREE FOG lid by calling 617-989-7599, or visiting us online!

Allow a slow trickle of water to flow through faucets connected to water pipes that run through unheated spaces.

If pipes freeze, use a hairdryer to thaw lines. Thawing this way may not be fast, but it will be safe. NEVER USE AN OPEN FLAME TO THAW PIPES.
